
With 295 students in Fifth through Eighth Grade, the RCDS Middle School offers a challenging and joyful experience that supports students' journey from dependent to independent learners. The program emphasizes the development of healthy work and study habits to ensure success with the increasing demands of academic studies, all the while exposing them to opportunities to explore new passions in the classroom, the arts, athletics, and leadership. Faculty advisors, grade-level deans, and systems of student progress monitoring - both social and academic - are at the core of the support offered to students on their journey to becoming independent learners and good community members. The Middle School has robust student support services, including a social worker, two learning specialists, and a study skills coordinator. Seventh and Eighth Grade are often linked together as part of the developmental and academic process, for example, in advising. The faculty is experienced, long-serving, and extraordinarily committed to their students' development and success.



The program is thoughtfully and appropriately scaffolded to meet the needs of students as they progress through Middle School and prepare for increased rigor and independence in Upper School:

- Fifth Grade is designed to help students make a smooth transition into Middle School, focused on building academic and organizational skills for future success. A bridge year between the self-contained classroom setting in Lower School to the more departmental structure of Middle School, Fifth Grade faculty work closely with students and parents to ensure success.
- Sixth Grade continues to reinforce students' ability to work independently with the support of their teachers and advisors. The curriculum requires more abstract thinking and logical reasoning, which leads to stimulating and active class discussions.
 Twenty new students typically join the class in Sixth Grade.
- Seventh Grade inspires students to take more responsibility for their success, learning how to become better organized and study with greater efficiency and effectiveness, including for cumulative exams. The choice of electives complete the program of study.
- Eighth Grade is designed to build upon the students' skills and intellectual curiosity as they prepare to transition to Upper School. More rigor, choice, and independence are supported by teachers and advisors who challenge and support student growth.

Visual and performing arts are considered part of the core academic program in Middle School. Students also have the opportunity to participate in athletics and clubs and have myriad opportunities for leadership.











The Middle School nurtures the development of an awareness of others and a commitment to diversity and inclusion in keeping with the RCDS mission. Faculty ensure their curricula and teaching styles reflect and promote empathy, understanding, and community. Additionally, students learn about diversity and inclusion through guest speakers, community gatherings, public purpose events, and travel opportunities.

Set on a beautiful 26-acre suburban campus, the facilities at RCDS are purpose-built to meet the needs of each age group and to inspire excellence, exploration, and skill development. Facilities include two main academic buildings, Lower School and Middle/Upper School libraries, administrative buildings, two dining rooms, a state-of-the-art performing arts center with classrooms, a dance studio, and 450-seat theater, innovative creative arts center, athletic center with hockey rink and squash courts, and four turf fields.
