The middle school years at Oakwood are focused on developing the full potential of each student in preparation for high school. Middle school students are recognized for their unique gifts and talents in an atmosphere of mutual respect. A dynamic curriculum, the support of nurturing teachers, and a warm spirit of friendship result in happy, self-confident, well-prepared people who are ready for the world of high school and beyond.

As students learn from experts in their fields, express themselves joyously and authentically, rise to clear academic expectations, follow and set moral examples, and participate in an exuberant culture of exploration, Oakwood School helps them grow into well-spoken, confident, vibrant individuals and citizens.

A true hallmark of the middle school academic program is the rotating electives, which offer developing learners the opportunity to select their path of study and focus on areas of passion. Through electives, students delve deeper into specific subjects and also interact with peers in other middle school grades. Top-level teachers create unique learning experiences for students based on their unique areas of expertise.

Beyond academics, Oakwood offers middle school students intentional learning opportunities through a comprehensive athletics program—with a dedicated Assistant Athletic Director for the middle school division. In addition, middle school students at Oakwood enjoy a robust slate of performing and visual arts electives, student leadership opportunities, and immersive week-long grade-level trips.

Responsibilities

The Middle School Head and Principal reports to the Head of School. The Head and Principal is charged with the comprehensive responsibility for all activities involving students and faculty in grades 6 through 8. Their specific responsibilities include the following:

Align Mission and Activities: Ensure the middle school's activities align with the school's mission, fostering a culture rooted in kindness, respect, and dignity.

Vision: Develop a cohesive, forward-thinking vision to enhance excellence in middle school education, advocating for the middle school while collaborating effectively with other school divisions.

Curriculum Alignment: Ensure curricular alignment between school divisions, overseeing all aspects of middle school operations and activities.

Educational Leadership: Oversee day-to-day operations, serve as the educational leader, and effectively communicate middle school programs and expectations to all stakeholders.

Athletics Oversight: Support the Athletic Director and Middle School Assistant Athletic Director to ensure the coordination and success of athletic programs, promoting student involvement, teamwork, and sportsmanship.

Development: Partner with the Development Department to collaborate on student-led and parent-centered fundraising and community engagement events and initiatives.

Administrative Management: Manage budget allocation, maintain academic records, and oversee grading standards.

Coordination of Activities: Coordinate various middle school activities such as field trips, student clubs, and after-school programs, enriching student experiences and fostering holistic development.

Strategic Collaboration and Advocacy Leadership: Act as a strategic and visionary thought leader and collaborative partner for the Head of School and Administrative Team, offering valuable insights and ideas to drive the school's strategic direction and growth while advocating for the specific needs and aspirations of the middle school.

Student and Community Engagement: Be a visible and supportive presence throughout the school, engaging regularly with students and parents, supporting their needs and the overall community. Collaborate with the Parent Service Auxiliary Board to foster parent-community cohesion.

Academic Oversight: Review and evaluate academic programs, ensuring high standards of learning.

Faculty Management and Development: Direct, observe, mentor, and evaluate faculty, supporting their growth and adherence to school policies.

Problem Solving and Collaboration: Address issues as they arise, and keep the Head of School informed of school needs and challenges.

Admission Events and Committee: Represent the middle school program through a series of dynamic events for prospective students and families; participate in Admissions and Scholarship Committees to evaluate and select new students.

Student Support and Success: Develop plans to support student success in collaboration with the Student Support Counselor.

Testing Facilitation: Facilitate standardized testing, ensuring smooth testing processes for students and faculty.

Coordination and Event Management: Maintain a comprehensive school event calendar, oversee co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, and organize school assemblies and programs.

Prioritize Dignity: Nurture diversity, equity, inclusion, and dignity within an educational context and throughout the Oakwood community, fostering an atmosphere that cherishes and honors diverse perspectives and backgrounds.

Championing Middle School Teachers
